- Some plants live in coral reefs.


 Many animals live in coral reefs, too.




- The water is not deep in coral reefs. The water is shallow.

 But lionfish do not roar.




- Some fish hide.

- Eels sleep in coral reefs in the day.Eels come out at night to get food.




- Many coral reefs are dying.
